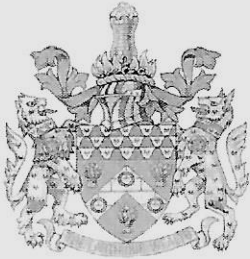

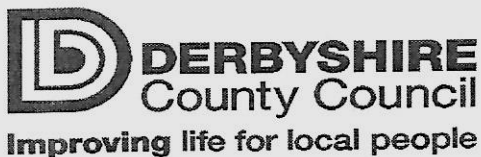

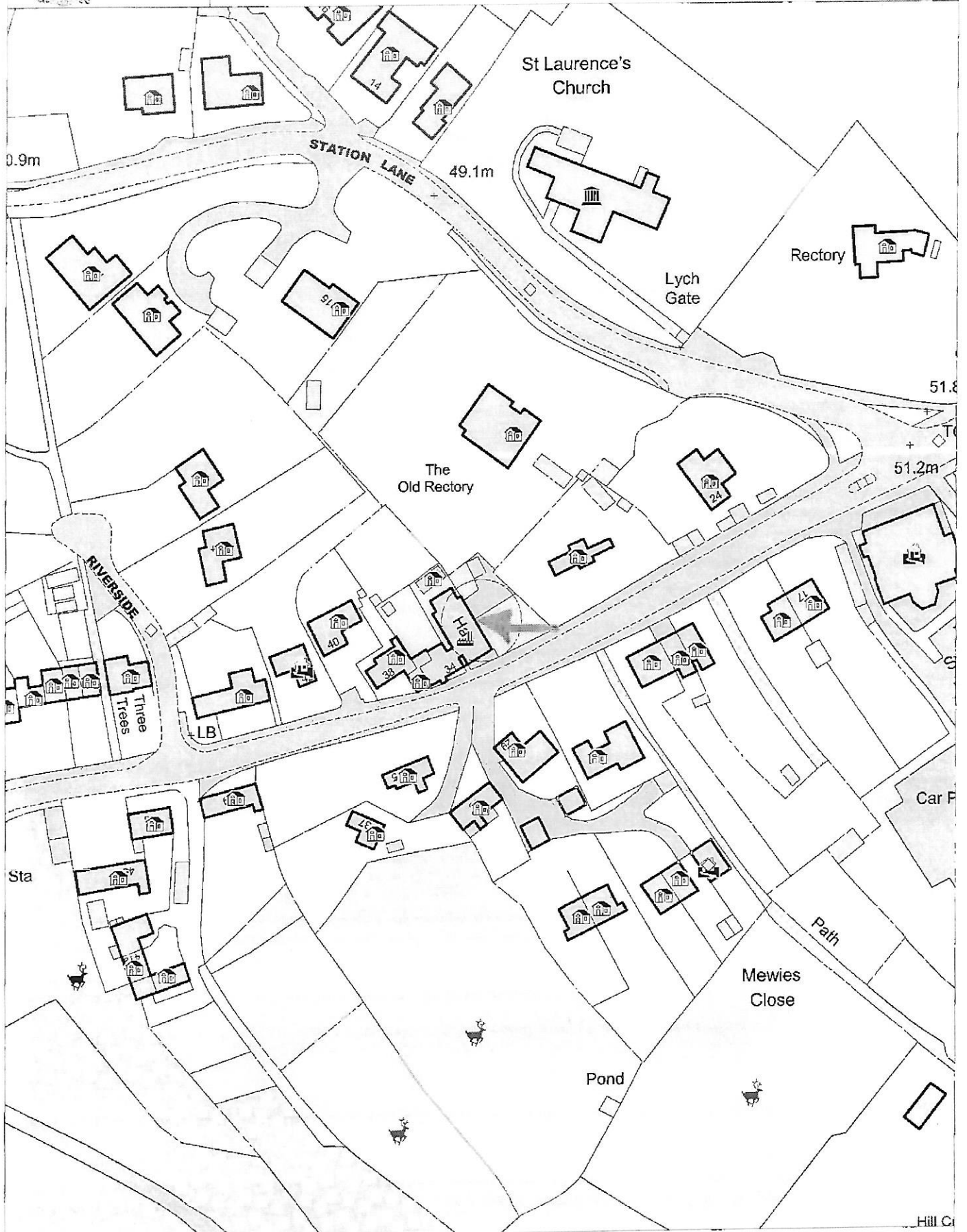

1	Chair's Introduction, Apologies	Action
	<p>Janice Pallett welcomed everyone to the meeting and introductions were made from the panel.</p> <p>Apologies were received from Sheila Jackson and Heather Wheeler MP</p>	
2	Minutes of last meeting (to be agreed) and update on actions	
	<p>The minutes were agreed as a true record of the last meeting.</p> <p>PC Bill Crerar was unable to give updates as he has been recalled and is to be replaced by PC Kev Cassidy. PCSO Dave McMillan gave his and PC Crerar's updates under Agenda Item 3.</p>	
3	Safer Neighbourhoods Sergeant's Overview / Priorities Update	
	<p>Sgt Summers reported the latest year to date crime statistics covering 1 April to 30 June 2015 as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Assault down from 16 last year to 12 this year • Robbery up from 0 last year to 1 this year • Sexual offences up from 0 last year to 5 this year • Dwelling burglary theft down from 3 last year to 2 this year • Non-dwelling burglary theft up from 11 last year to 12 this year • Theft of motor vehicle up from 2 last year to 3 this year • Theft from motor vehicle up from 5 last year to 7 this year • All theft (including other) up from 40 last year to 44 this year • Damage (including arson) down from 22 last year to 5 this year • Drug offences remain the same at 2 each year • All crime (including miscellaneous) down from 82 last year to 72 this year • Anti-social behaviour up from 59 last year to 65 this year <p>Sgt Summers highlighted the increase in sexual offences, but reassured the meeting that this follows the national trend following the Jimmy Savile case in that people are more confident reporting such issues to the Police. Sgt Summers also mentioned that damage offences have returned to normal levels now following a spate of car scratching being reported last year.</p> <p>Sgt Summers requested that parking concerns be logged by dialling 101. The PCSO will then address concerns and report back on actions taken.</p>	

	<p>All crime figures are available on line and on the police website.</p> <p>PCSO McMillan gave his update including action points from the last meeting as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The issue of HGV's illegally using roads as shortcuts was addressed by PC Crerar, PCSO McMillan and Trading Standards officer. On 23 March there were no sightings during a visit to Drakelow, but 2 tickets were issued on Woodville Road, Overseal. A follow up visit on 30 March resulted in 1 ticket at Drakelow and 1 at Overseal. Discussions were held with transport managers at Reabrook at Moira and the building site at Hepworth Road, Woodville in order to try to educate drivers about weight restrictions. • Inconsiderate parking at Rosliston – PCSO McMillan issued 4 tickets last Sunday. • Drug offences – 1 person is on bail charged with the production of cannabis at Coton-in-the-Elms. 1 call was received about a youth smoking a small amount of cannabis at the youth shelter at Overseal. 2 people are being charged with the production of cannabis at Linton Heath. • Crime Prevention Officer has given advice on site security at building sites at Drakelow and Coton Park. No crimes have been reported recently. • Number Plate Operation will take place at Overseal next week. 	
4	Partnership Update / Funding / New project ideas	
	<p>Phil Marriott apologised to those who may not have received their minutes and paperwork in time. He followed with his report as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No funding applications received for this area so far. Phil reminded the meeting that funding is available for appropriate projects. • Phil emphasised the importance of using good quality locks, coach bolts and non-return head screws to protect valuables in sheds from thieves. The Safer Homes Scheme helps vulnerable people by providing locks and alarms ensuring homes are properly secured free of charge. Anyone can refer vulnerable people to the CVS for this service. • Liberation day took place on 22 May and was very successful again. Entertainment was provided by a Beatles tribute band. • Phil highlighted a variety of leaflets he had provided such as How to Stay Safe Online; Green Dog Walker Scheme; Summer Activities for Children and the Safer South Derbyshire Partnership update newsletter. 	<p>PM to order new supply of Green Dog Walker leaflets for SDDC offices</p>
5	Local Issues – open forum	
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Resident raised ongoing issue of cold calling at Linton despite window stickers and an article in the Burton Mail. Phil Marriott agreed to revisit the problem with Trading Standards. • Resident raised ongoing issue of dog fouling at Linton. He also highlighted new procedures used by the local authority in Daventry as reported in a national newspaper where dog walkers receive an instant £100 fine if found not to be carrying poo bags. Sgt Summers suggested that more information be sought with a view to implementing similar procedures in South Derbyshire using the Crime & Policing Act introduced last year. • Resident reported picking up spliffs in playground at Linton recently. 	<p>PM to contact Trading Standards</p> <p>PM to seek advice from Legal Dept</p>
